Course Description:

I. Thai Language for Non-Thai Students Level 1 – 2

Level 1

The emphasis in this course is placed on the acquisition of language skill; listening, speaking and vocabulary. Students learn and follow commands and requests. They give short statements and ask questions using polite ending particles. They use polite expressions for making requests, asking pardon, and thanking people. They use appropriate pronouns and vocabulary that is appropriate for adults and peers at school.

They recognize Thai consonant, read and write simple words including nouns, pronouns, verbs related to the unit of instructions. They use polite expressions and appropriate gestures with adults.

Level 2

The emphasis is placed on the acquisition of language skills; listening, speaking and the vocabulary development. Students learn to follow and respond to instructions. They ask Y/N questions, answer with phrases, statements using polite ending particles. They use polite expressions for making requests, asking pardon, and thanking people. They use appropriate pronouns and vocabulary that is appropriate for adults and peers at school. The students are encouraged to use the target language through a variety of language activities. For reading and writing, they learn to write letters of their own names, Thai numbers and words. They also read and recognize common public signs. They understand and participate in cultural activities in school and outside.

They learn parts of speech, such as nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, classifiers, prepositions and conjunctions including and/but. They use polite gestures and ending particles. They learn to recognize two different tones.

II. Thai Culture for Non-Thai Students Stage 1 – 3

Stage 1

- I Students show appropriate Thai manners at school
- II Students actively participate in Thai cultural activities organized by the school (Wai Kru, Loi Krathong, Songkran, and Flag Salute), and recognize the Thai literature related to the Thai cultural events
- III Students show respect to the symbols representing the Monarchs, the King's Anthem, the Thai Flag and the National Anthem
- IV Students learn about local products and a Thai folktale

Stage 2

- I Students show appropriate Thai manners at school. They use appropriate Introduction of self and others. They learn and talk about "Wai" for different occasions, "graab" (seniority), and greet appropriately
- II Students describe Thai holidays, Thai cultural practices and celebrations. They understand and actively participate in the Thai cultural activities organized by the school (Wai Kru, Loi Krathong, Songkran, and Flag Salute)), and learn the Thai literature related to the Thai cultural events
- III Students show respect to the symbols representing the Monarchs, the King's Anthem, the Thai Flag and the National Anthem
- IV Students acknowledge the Thai cultural practices that are different from one's own practices and respond to the Thai practices appropriately. They follow Thai etiquettes; they learn about Do and Don't in Thailand
- V Students learn about geographical features, local products and relevant Thai folktales

Stage 3

- I Students conduct themselves appropriately at school.
- II Students describe Thai holidays, Thai cultural practices and celebrations. They actively participate in and understand the meaning of the cultural practices. They learn the Thai literature related to the Thai cultural events.
- III Students show respect to the symbols representing the Monarchs, the King's Anthem, the Thai Flag and the National Anthem. They can explain the meanings of the symbols of Principal institutions of Thailand: Nation, Religion, and Kingship.
- IV Students compare similarities and differences of Thai and students' cultural practices, Thai holidays, celebrations and respond to the Thai practices appropriately. They follow Thai etiquettes, practice appropriate Thai manners in the classroom and show respect to seniority. They learn about Do and Don't in Thailand.
- V Students learn and describe geographical features, products of different regions and local Thai literature.
